

## Army Group 1944 Code of Conduct.

All members of AG44 shall, in keeping with our goals and objectives, be governed by and subject to the following code of ethics:

1. The use of any item that does not belong to you without permission is prohibited. The theft of any item, no matter how small, is grounds for prosecution and dismissal from AG44.

2. Members must follow authenticity guidelines as set forth by the event host. Period grooming and uniform standards must be adhered to in order to participate in AG44 events.

3. It is forbidden to use, or threaten to use, any photo, video or written correspondence of any member of AG44 while in uniform for any untoward or ill intent against that member.

4. While in a camp or barracks area, respect the right of privacy of other campers.

5. The use or possession of Federally classified illegal drugs/narcotics is cause for immediate expulsion. This includes marijuana.

6. Failure to follow event posted or announced rules can and will lead to expulsion from AG44 and from future AG44 events.

7. Keep safety and authenticity in mind at all times.

8. Do not use profanity, slander, libelous statements in correspondence to convey any threat, implied or real, to any member.

9. Members of AG44 cannot use AG44 publications or events for any political purpose.

10. Proprietary AG44 membership information cannot be released without the Board of Directors as well as the individual member's approval.

11. It is the responsibility of all members and units present at any event to stand safety and authenticity inspections.

12. As a point of etiquette, keep late night activities reasonable.

13. No alcohol consumption EIGHT hours prior to or during game play. Members that appear to be under the influence will be asked to leave and be subject to expulsion.

14. Unit Commanders shall be responsible for enforcing AG44 standards of conduct and behavior for all members of their unit. This means performing one's due diligence (communicating rules and standards, ammo checks, safety briefs, training and intra-unit enforcement, etc) to help ensure that rules are followed.

15. Keep all campsites and barracks policed and secure.

16. Do not leave campfires unattended.

17. Do not argue over the calling of hits.

18. When traveling to or from any event, or interacting with the public, members will exercise good judgment when wearing of uniforms.

19. Follow all applicable state and federal laws.
